She also attended the School of Dentistry sponsored by her high school; Essex County College of Newark and American Business Institute of Newark.

Crystal worked as a dental assistant in East Orange as a part of her training. Ernest Mitchell, Jr. She loved attending Sunday School every week and took an active part in this service.
