She was educated in the Newark Public School system, attending Monmouth Street Elementary School and Arts High School. She also attended Newark State Teacher's College (now Kean University) as an Art major.

If Time to Love.....As a young woman, Jeannette met, fell in love and married Robert L. Carter. During their marriage, she and Robert were blessed with three sons Robert Jr., Wayne and Aaron. She guided her sons to believe they could achieve whatever goals they set for themselves and encouraged them to pursue college after high school graduation. Despite a separation, Jeannette remained married to Robert Carter, Sr. until his passing in 1990.

Jeannette was a supportive wife and devoted mother. She took great pleasure raising her sons and spending time with family and friends and bowling.
