Obituary

Jeanette T. Pearsall Williams was born December 15, 1919 in Sheffield, Alabama. As an infant she moved with her parents, the late Edward and Bessie Pearsall to Cincinnati, Ohio and later to Newark, NJ, where she was educated in the public school system. She attended Barringer High School and graduated from Central High School.

Mrs. Williams died Saturday, May 30, 2015 at Summit Nursing Home. She was a Collector Manager with Internal Renevue Services in Newark when she retired in 1988 after thirty-nine years of service.

Always active and ambitious, Jeanette enrolled in Mrs. Potter Business School located in East Orange where she pursued a course of study in business. She also completed a course in beauty culture at the Apex Beauty School and was licensed by the state of New Jersey. She was a graduate of Essex County College in Newark, NJ and attended Bloomfield College persuing a degree in accounting.

Jeanette was converted at an early age, being baptized at Mt. Olivet Baptist Church under the leadership of the late, Rev. W.W. Fleming and remained a faithful member until her passing.

Jeanette was the first President of the Board of Christian Education appointed by Rev. Roger P. Derricotte, a trustee and Financial Secretary of the Floral Ministry and assistant Sunday school teacher.

Jeanette was an active member of the Essex County Urban League for more than thirty-five years. Where she served as secretary and financial secretary for many years, receiving several awards and citations a member of many social groups "The Women" and several bridge clubs.
