Susie (also known as Susan) Green Armstrong was the "seventh child born Christmas Day with a Veil over her face" to Irene Barrington and Atlas Green. She was born in Jacksonville, Florida, in Duvall County.

After losing her mother at the young age of seven years old, she was raised by distant cousins, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas, who were deacons in Jacksonville, Florida. She always wanted to be a writer. She started writing poetry at twelve years old. From then, she never ceased to write poetry. She attended Stanton High School in Jacksonville, Florida. When she was eighteen years old, she moved to Norfolk, Virginia, then to Baltimore, Maryland, then New York City. One of many of her famous phrases regarding living in New York was "I still had that southern hospitality when I got to New York, and New York was a tough place to live, so I had to get New York tough or go back to Florida. I GOT NEW YORK TOUGH." She would remain throughout the rest of her years in New York City.

She met and married Rolando Sabio. From that marriage, three children were born, Rigoberto Sabio, Antone Alecia Jacob (deceased), and Tanya Sabio. She met her second husband, Huntley A. Armstrong Jr. in the late 1970's and they got married in 1980 at West End Presbyterian Church where he soon joined and became a member then became a deacon. Both him and Susan remained members until their passing. One of the fondest memories for her granddaughter, Susan Andrea Culbreth was taking these long bus rides on the #7 bus. They would get on and never get off, going all the way to the bus depot waiting for the bus drivers to change and coming back. Now that was a trip!! And Andrea loved it!!!
