On March 19, 1951, Valerie Denise Williams was born to James T. Williams and Bessie L. Adams, in New York City, NY.

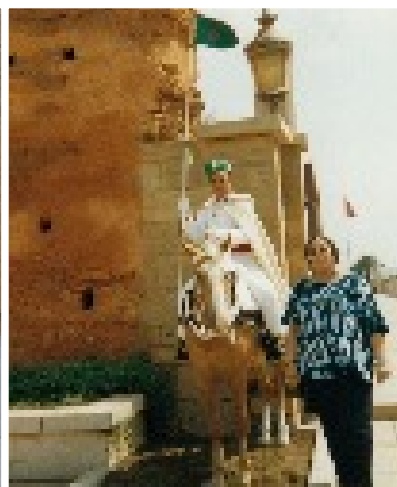
She was raised and educated in New Jersey, culminating with a B.A. degree from Jersey City State College. This faithful servant was called home, at age 64, on July 9, 2015.

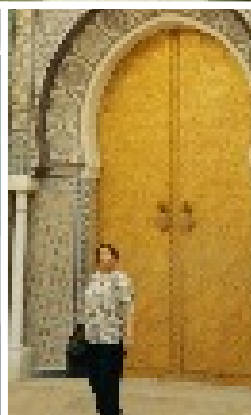
