

Obituary

Timothy Tyler, Jr. was born on March 9, 1953 in Spring Hill, North Carolina in his great uncle Eddie's home to Timothy Tyler, Sr. and Tullie Ann Brown Tyler. It was his mother's task to name him. She chose Timothy in honor of her husband, but during a brief disagreement due to the stresses of giving birth when her husband asked, "What are you going to name him?" She sarcastically replied, "Boot, I'm naming him Boot". That name stuck and became his nickname throughout his life.

Shortly after he was born the family returned to New York City. As a child, he was very curious and adventurous so he would be out and about with friends as often as he could. He was quite the artist, as he would sketch portraits of historical figures, still life, and even architecture.

He attended Alfred E. Smith High School in the Bronx and then on to Bronx Community College. Timothy worked several years as a maintenance technician while helping his mother at home. In his spare time he would feed his healthy appetite for knowledge as he took an extreme interest in world history. One of his favorite places to visit was the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture in Harlem, where he spent hours reading books about Egyptian Pharaohs, the development of African civilizations, and important figures such as Nelson Mandela. He studied German and Chinese history and the world wars. Excited about the information he obtained, he eagerly shared what he learned with others and found joy in teaching his nephews about Malcolm X, Martin Luther King, Huey P. Newton and many other African American front runners in the Civil Rights movement. He was also in to sports. His favorite teams were the Brooklyn Nets and the New York Mets.

On Friday, August 14th, 2015, Timothy "Boot" Tyler departed this life. He leaves to mourn: his mother, his sisters, Ellomise Tracey Patterson, Johnnie Mae Tyler, Wyonie Tyler, Christ Tyler; his brother, Jc Tyler and sister-in-law, Laura Tyler.
