Reflections of Life

Mrs. Willie Mae LaBoard was born to Nancy Jane Lawrence (deceased) and William Lawrence (deceased), on May 24, 1915 in Portsmouth, Virginia. She was the oldest of two children born from this union.

She was fondly called Willie by her friends and Mae by her family. She traveled to New York City at the age of 6 and attended Elementary School. She stopped attending school at the age of 14, to work to help support her family.

She met Joseph La Board (deceased) of Charleston, South Carolina and they were married in 1936. From this union, two children were born, a daughter, Nana Amma Ansaa Atei and son, Earl LaBoard, who passed away at an early age.

Mrs. LaBoard worked as a seamstress in a sewing factory making men's clothing. She retired and went on to enjoy life to the fullest, by going to movies, theaters and dances. She especially enjoyed dancing to live bands. Some of her favorite dance halls were the Savoy Ballroom and the Harlem Renaissance Ballroom, during the height of their heyday. She also attended the Queen's Ball in Harlem, NY every Thanksgiving eve as well as attending the Jewel Box Review at the Apollo Theater. She was always there with a listening ear and to give helpful advice. She was very active in the Davidson Senior Center in the Bronx, NY housing complex where she resided. In later life she had religious sessions with Jehovah Witnesses members in her home.

She was a proud and great supporter of her daughter, Nana Amma Ansaa Atei during her training and career as the 1st Akan Okomfo (Priest) in America.

Mrs. LaBoard was a very independent, strong and proud woman. She cooked, cleaned, shopped, ironed and took care of herself in her advancing years. She did at a point have Home Health Aides to assist her in her activities of daily living. Ethel Summer was a neighbor, friend and like a caregiver. She was always by her side. From 2009 Nana Ansaa became a caretaker along with the help of Ethel Summer, assisting with her mother's daily needs, until she was called home to glory on August 17, 2015.

As the last of her siblings and many other family members, she leaves to cherish her memories, her daughter Nana Amma Ansaa Atei. She will also be greatly missed by the Akan and cultural communities, friends and extended family members. The community will always fondly remember Nana Ansaa's mother attending numerous Akan spiritual events as well other cultural community gatherings. She was always seen enjoying all occasions and festivities.
