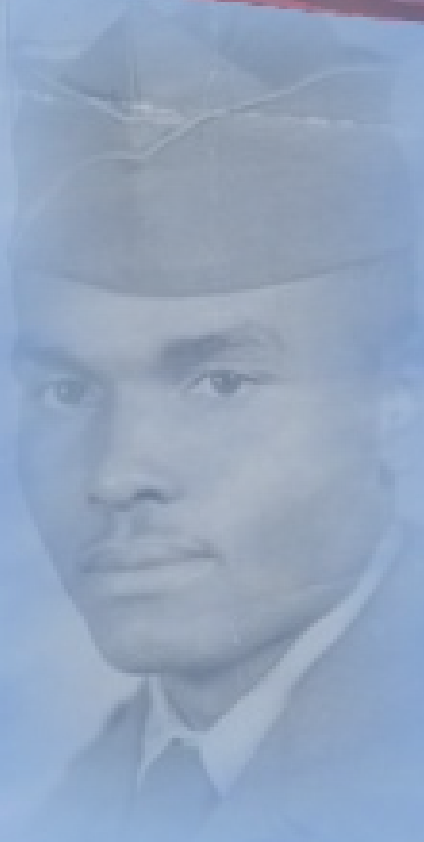

Reflections of Life

Vincent Drumright was born March 14, 1928 in Halifax, Virginia. He was one of seven children born to the late Raymond and Lula Drumright.

He was educated in the public schools in Roxboro, NC.

At an early age, he confessed Christ as his personal saviour. He was baptized. He served as a Sunday School teacher at his home church Bailey Chapel Methodist Church Roxboro, NC. He later joined the St. Luke Baptist Church then located on Pearl St. Paterson under the leadership of Rev. A.M. Tyler.

After high school, Vincent was drafted in the United States Army. He served in the Korean War during the 1950's. He received an honorable discharge.

He was united in marriage to Sadie (Dance). This union was blessed with one precious daughter. Vincent and his family relocated to Paterson, NJ where he resided until his death.
