



**Ivy Mae Ames** was born on October 17, 1921 at Roosevelt Hospital in New York to Annie Frances Bailey of Jamaica, WI and Adrian Brooks. She had three sisters, Louise Anthony, Carmen Vaughn and Joyce Brooks who predeceased her.

She was educated in the NYC School system, moving to the Bronx at the age of 14. On February 5, 1939, Ivy married Morris James Whiting and to that union, one daughter was born-Elaine Joyce Whiting.

As a young woman, Ivy was a very popular and well known Barmaid in Harlem, New York. She was a class act. It might be said that she was an Icon. She was known for her stylish dress, quick wit, no nonsense attitude and jovial personality. She loved to party, travel and have a good time. She loved music, especially Jazz and the Blues. In addition, she loved to play Pokeeno, Scrabble, Jeopardy and the slots at the casino. More times than not, she was a winner. Everyone who knew her loved her.

Ivy moved to New Jersey in 1960, where she resided until her transition. She was employed as a family nurse for the Sieminski family for many years in Saddle River, NJ. She was employed by the City of Englewood under James Pleasant for three years assisting residents with finding employment and obtaining other necessary assistance, until with the help of Police Captain Kenneth Tinsley, becoming employed by General Motors which she retired from after 19 years in 1991.

Ivy was an active member of various fraternal organizations until the time of her passing. She was a member of Ideal Temple #290, where she served in many different leadership roles in multiple departments. She served as Daughter Ruler from 1970-1974, Financial Secretary from 1994-2011, State Directress for 22 years, Past Grand Daughter Ruler, Grand Directress of Fire and Safety, just to name a few. She was also a member of the American Legion Auxiliary #58, Order of Eastern Stars and AARP of Englewood. Additionally, she worked at the 4th Ward voting polls until the age of 93, and even there, she was running things.

Ivy accepted Christ in her youth, but began her relationship and walk with the Lord in 1994, when she joined the Community Baptist Church of Englewood. She served on the Pastor's Aid, Faith Partners and on the Sarah M. Clark Mother's Ministry. When she was unable to attend regular Sunday worship, she would attend Strength at Noon.
