She made decorative pillows, home furnishings, perfumed satchels and other crafty items. She was an Avon Rep since the 1960's. She always dressed elegantly and stylish and never drank, smoked, nor hung out; she was too classy for that .

Mommy was a good Christian lady. She was an active and long time member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Harlem, NY and became a member at St. Paul's Episcopal Church after moving to NJ.

After her beloved husband of fifty-three years passed away in November 2008, she seemed to have lost that "spark" that defined her energy. Mommy loved life, her family and our Lord Jesus Christ. Her favorite saying was "Thank GOD for Life" We are going to miss you immensely Mrs. Brice. Rest in heaven peacefully.
