Legacy of Martha Dunn Hatcher

Deaconess Martha D. Hatcher was born May 22, 1931 in Augusta, Georgia to the late Mr. James Dunn and Mrs. Willie Mae Dunn. Martha Hatcher was passionately devoted as a wife, mother, and humble servant of God. Mrs. Hatcher's marriage to Deacon James L. Hatcher extends beyond the diamond jubilee year, and serves as a true testimony of love and inspiration for her children, Toni, Muriel, and James, and her community. Mrs. Hatcher's greatest life legacy was her capability to love, hope, give freely, and endure with sacrifice and strength for others. In addition to these qualities, she possessed a natural love for knowledge, was an avid reader, and a self-motivated learner. These attributes can be measured by her educational history, which reached its distinction of excellence when she graduated Summa Cum Laude from New York University.

Mrs. Hatcher's undergraduate training in home economics ignited a lifelong love of culinary arts. As a culinarian she understood food science, nutrition, and diet. Mrs. Hatcher skillfully combined her love for elegance, taste, and presentation with her culinary training to develop her unforgettable trademark as an entrepreneur. Mrs. Hatcher's precious moments was her Art of Elegant Entertainment. She hosted elaborate social gatherings that left a notable impression on her guests. Mrs. Hatcher was featured in Food for the Soul publication (Abyssinian Baptist Church congregation) and the New York Times for her entrepreneurship. She took delight in her career as a dietitian with the New York City Department of Education, and was among the first African-American dietitians employed at Lenox Hill Hospital.

Mrs. Hatcher was a servant of God's Kingdom Agenda. She was a devoted member of Abyssinian Baptist Church, and member of Abyssinian's Deaconess Board and other ministries. As a member of the Convent Avenue Baptist Church, Mrs. Hatcher completed her ministerial training in the Stephen Series and met the requirements to serve as a Stephen Minister. At Brown Memorial Baptist Church she served a devoted member. Equipped to teach God's Word, Deaconess Hatcher embarked on a spiritual journey, bringing faith and God's Word in diversified communities with the prospect of renewing hope. Her work as a Stephen Minister was her most cherished accomplishment.

Mrs. Hatcher was a Golden Life Member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. As a soror and a member of the Bronx Alumni Chapter, she understood and acknowledged the progression of critical times. As a result, her affiliations included organizations that revered justice such as the NAACP. She became an active public servant among civil and political organizations for change. Throughout her life she empowered others with timeless strength, and inspired others with her intelligence, life standards, and faith.
