<u>Obituary</u>

Constance (**Connie**) **Loretta Mendes** peacefully transitioned home November 4, 2016 at her apartment in Union, New Jersey.

Constance was born in Newark, New Jersey on December 2, 1925 to the late Charles A. Shell and the late Irene Shell (Worrell). Educated in the Newark, New Jersey Public School system, she attended Abington Avenue Elementary School and graduated from Barringer High School. Constance was married in November, 1945 and gave birth to two daughters, Sheila and Sandra (Sandy).

Constance worked at a war plant during World War II and later at The Western Electric Company, Kearney, NJ for 16 years. Then she returned to school and became a Licensed Practical Nurse in June, 1970. Constance was a wonderful and very caring nurse who worked at Little Sisters of the Poor, Newark, NJ, Essex County Geriatric Center, Belleville, NJ and in several private homes. After she moved to South Carolina, Constance worked in respite care and at an adult special needs residential program. Also, she taught CPR and standard First Aid.

Constance relocated to Fort Mill and later North Augusta, South Carolina where she (at 66) married her beloved soul mate, the late Elwood John Mendes (at 68) on April 23, 1992. In October, 2007 she returned to New Jersey after the deaths of her beloved husband in November, 2004 and brother Carl Shell (her North Augusta neighbor at that time) in November, 2006.

Constance was baptized at an early age, served as a dedicated member of several churches and continued to grow spiritually throughout her life. She was very honored when her beloved Christ Resurrection Missionary Baptist Church, East Orange, NJ named her "Mother of the Church" on May 4, 2014.

Constance was a very friendly, energetic, feisty, resilient and beautiful lady. She loved to help and encourage others, and in later years, many called her "Mother Mendes". However, her greatest joy and "work" was sharing her profound faith, exceptional wisdom and unconditional love with family, friends and everyone she came in contact with.

Constance was involved in many Christian classes, organizations and Bible studies. She also participated in numerous prison, salvation, prayer and healing ministries over the years. Constance truly believed that she would behold Him face to face when she flew home to be with her "Daddy God".
