



Reflections of Life

Curtis Clark was born in Kershaw, South Carolina on October 22, 1940 to the late Fred and Margaret Clark. He was their 3rd eldest child. It was there that Curtis spent his formative years. He attended the Jackson School in Camden, South Carolina until his sophomore year when he relocated to Englewood, New Jersey where he attended and graduated from Dwight Morrow High School in 1960.

After high school, Curtis began his career at Macy's Department Store in Paramus, New Jersey. It was here that he met the love of his life, which he knew would be his wife, Naomi (Bonnie) Brown. He knew immediately that she would be his wife and being the charming young man that he was, he wooed her and she did, indeed, become his wife and the mother of their devoted children, Tracy and Kyle.

Subsequent to working at Macy's, Curtis ventured on to United Parcel Service where he was very well respected. After many successful and happy years at UPS where he loved his employment, he exclaimed he "liked retirement much better". He retired in 2004. After retirement he and his wife traveled making sure to visit family and friends.

Curtis and Naomi raised their family and spent most of their life in Bayville, New Jersey. They were faithful members of Macedonia Baptist Church in Lakewood, New Jersey. Curtis served on the Board of Trustees of the church, sang in the Men's Choir, and volunteered to transport the elderly and disabled.

He loved his children, grandchildren and siblings and spoke with pride about them to all who had his ear. He was known for putting others before himself. Doing whatever was needed to help or assist in the lives of many. As a loving brother and dedicated friend he spent many hours calling and visiting to make sure all was well.

Curtis Clark leaves to mourn his lovely wife of nearly 53 years, Naomi Brown Clark.
