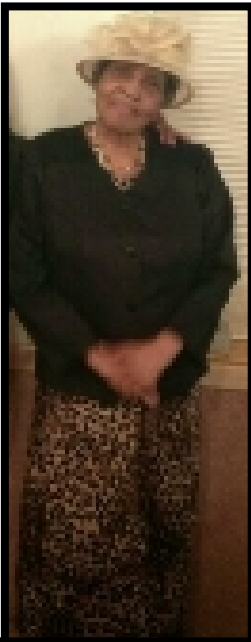

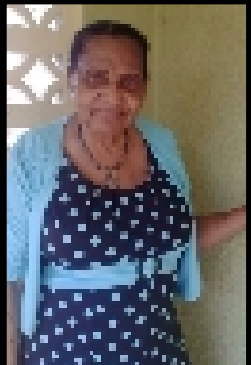
Life Reflections
