

Reflections of Life

Vera Myrtle Ward was born on February 13, 1923 in Baconton, Georgia to Charles and Fannie Ward. She was the fifth of twelve children.

After completing one year of junior college, Vera left home with her younger brother Thomas and moved to Sharon Hill, PA to live with family. There she met and fell in love with William Henry Merriweather Jr.

Bill or Billy Boy, as often called in his younger days, was a charismatic, handsome, outgoing life of the party young sailor smitten by the beautiful Georgia peach. He said the right things and had the right moves. Vera was hooked.

They married on May 2, 1944 in Wilmington, Delaware. The happy couple settled in Brooklyn and later became the proud parents of June Olivia. After Brooklyn, they moved into the Colonial Housing in Harlem, home of the Polo Grounds and the New York Yankees. Second daughter Dawn Elissa was born during this time.

In 1962, the family purchased their first home in Teaneck, New Jersey. Later Joy Christina was born. During this time Vera noticed the need for childcare and began taking care of children from the neighborhood. She provided a clean, caring, structured and disciplined home where children could grow and learn. Parents went to work knowing their children were in a safe environment.

Vera and Bill enjoyed entertaining family and friends. They hosted many cookouts, birthday celebrations and holiday gatherings. Vera was an excellent cook – baking cakes, cookies and the best home-made rolls.

In 1975, Vera became "Mumzie" after the birth of her grandson and "buddy", Justin. A few years later the

family welcomed two additional blended grandchildren Jac Jr. and Jeneen Graves.

Mumzie was a pet lover, which included birds, bunnies, first dog Fuzzy and her offspring Flip and Flop. Later sister Jeanette's beloved dog Toto was added to the family.

After the passing of her husband of 40 years, she sold her home in Teaneck and moved to Hampton, GA. She became good friends with her new neighbor Margie. She was employed part-time as a daycare worker at Sheltering Arms. A few years passed and Mumzie was on the road again. Homesick for family,she sold her house in Georgia and purchased a two family home in Hackensack, NJ with her sister Doris.

Back in New Jersey, Mumzie was hired as a part-time daycare worker for infants and toddlers at Take My Hand in Leonia. She later cared for children in her home. She attended and enjoyed services at First Baptist Church of Hackensack. When her health declined, Mumzie continued her faith and trust in God with dignity and grace. She found comfort in singing hymns and reading scripture and meditations with her daughters. The view from her window enabled her to enjoy the birds at the feeder and bird bath.

Vera M. Merriweather was preceded in death by parents Charles and Fannie Ward, husband William, siblings Charles Jr., Ella, William, Doris, Jeanette, Helen, Booker T, Henry and Mary.
