Neomia received her education in the public schools of Orangeburg, South Carolina. In 1957, she married John Wesley Wright Sr. from Orangeburg.

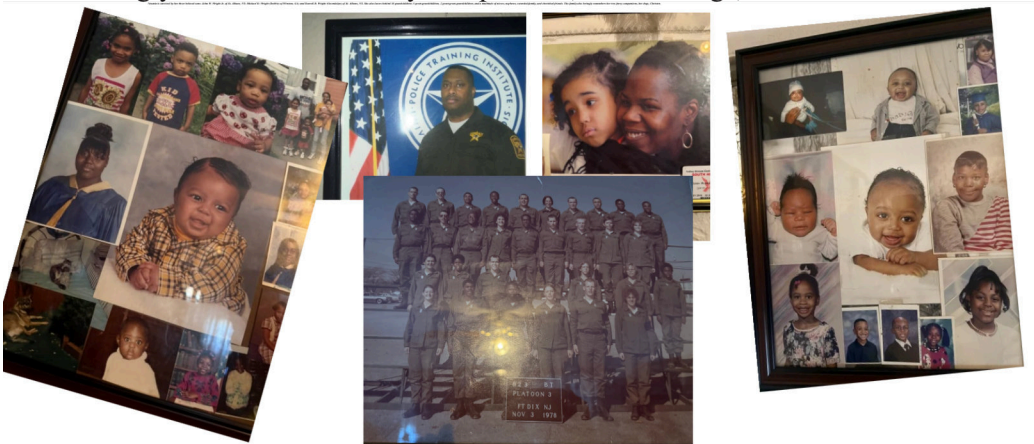
