The Life and Legacy of Pauline E. Robinson

Pauline E. Robinson was born on November 22, 1960, in St. Elizabeth, Jamaica, West Indies.

She was the third of seven children born to Mr. Amram Robinson and Mrs. Meynell Robinson.

Pauline spent her formative years attending Seaward All-Age School, also known as Tower Hill School, where she received her primary and secondary education. She later continued her studies at the YWCA School Leavers' Institute and went on to attend Fitz Henley Business College. Throughout her younger years, Pauline was also a dedicated member of the Jamaica Red Cross Society.

Pauline was a woman of many talents, but one of her greatest passions was sewing and dressmaking. She had a true gift for creating beautiful clothing and could bring fabrics to life with her hands. Sewing was more than simply something she did; it was an important part of who she was. Her creativity, skill, and attention to detail could be seen in the many beautiful pieces she created throughout the years. She took great pride in her work and was truly gifted at her craft.

Pauline also had a deep love for music. In 1987, alongside her identical twin sister, Paulette Robinson, and Marcia Higgs, she became a member of the dancehall reggae trio Higgs & Twins. The group was known for its collaboration with Lovindeer on "Wild Gilbert." Pauline played an instrumental role in helping the group get its start, encouraging the trio to audition at King Jammy's Studio.

After eventually making Queens, New York, her home, Pauline continued to dedicate herself to her family and community. She served as President of the PTA at P.S./M.S. 47 and worked as a Bus Matron for Logan Bus Company until the time of her passing.

Pauline was also a woman of faith. Staying true to her Christian values, she remained devoted to the Seventh-day Adventist Church throughout her life and was a member of New Haven SDA Church, Old Harbour SDA Church, and Queens Faith SDA Temple.

Pauline leaves to cherish her precious memory her beloved mother, Meynell Robinson; her two sons, Floyd K. Wilson and Jermaine O. Orr; her grandson, Elijah Wilson; her two granddaughters, Emilia Wilson and Samaya Wilson; her sisters, Paulette, Shauneil, and Sandra; as well as her nieces, nephews, cousins, aunts, uncles, extended family members, and dear friends.

Pauline's life was filled with creativity, music, service, faith, and love.

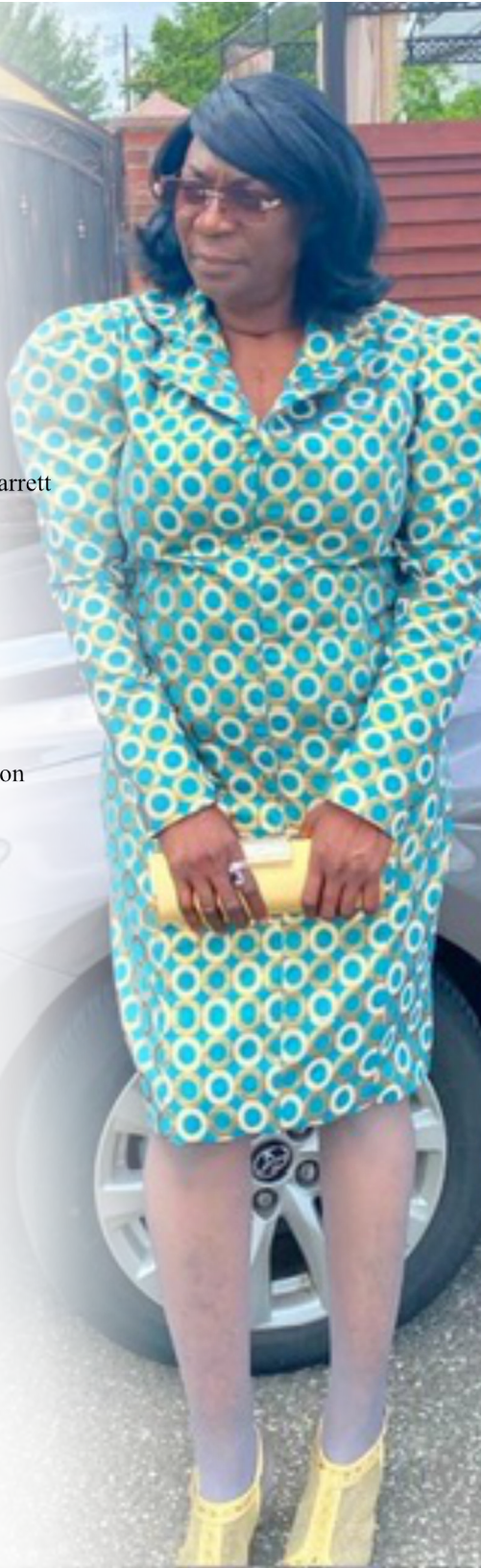
