Obituary

Millicent Wilhelmina Hollmond was born in Brooklyn on June 9th, 1939 to Harley and Thelma Hollmond. There, she was raised by her loving parents, along with her younger siblings Sylvania, Laura, and Terrance.

As a child, Millicent frequently attended Zion Baptist Church with her godparents. Her Godmother, Alberta McCrimmons, was a Deaconess, and her Godfather, William McCrimmons, was a Minister. At an early age, Millicent accepted the Lord and was baptized as a young lady.

Millicent attended Morrison Junior High School and graduated from Brooklyn Homemaking H.S. (currently Clara Barton High School for Health Professions), Baruch College, and Berean Bible Institute.

In 1958, Millicent Hollmond married Frederick Arthur Moore, and they had three children: Darrell Arthur, Ronald Craig, and Robin Leslye. In 1970, they dissolved their marriage.

Millicent Moore worked for the Board of Education as a Teacher's Assistant for five years, then for the NYC Department of Finance as Principal Administrative Associate for twenty-five years until her retirement.

Millicent W. Moore was ordained a Deacon at Berean Baptist Church on December 12th, 1998. During her tenure as Deacon, she fellowshipped with the sick and shut-in members of Berean and served Holy Communion. Deacon Moore also supported the Pastoral Ministry headed by Reverend T. Arnold Nance and was Assistant Superintendent of the Adult Sunday School Department. Deacon Moore taught with the Time Release Program for Elementary School Children; she remembers when it was called Religious Instruction. Deacon Moore later joined the Senior Citizens Ministry where she shared the Word of God with the seniors at Berean Gardens Senior Housing. Deacon Moore was also a member of the Christian Endeavor Ministry. As you can tell, Deacon Moore had a passion for sharing God's word and loved all of her students and the people she ministered to.

One of Deacon Moore's many achievements was the honor of being selected as one of Brooklyn's Sunday School Teachers of the Year by the Brooklyn Sunday School Union, April 8th, 2012. Deacon Moore also received training from the NYS Office for the Aging, became a Certified Long Term Care Ombudsman, and was assigned to the Carlton Nursing Home in Brooklyn.

Millicent loved to travel; she loved reading the Bible, crocheting, and most of all, her family and their monthly gatherings at her home.

Millicent was preceded in death by two of her siblings, Laura and Terrance.

Millicent W. Moore is survived by her three children, Darrell Arthur Moore and his wife Onize of Cleburne, TX; Ronald Craig Moore of Far Rockaway, NY; and Robin Leslye Moore-Young and her husband Leroy of Milton, DE. Grandchildren Curtis Gary King, Yvonne Angela Moore, Darrell Alexi Moore, Jr., Craig Arthur Moore, Beniah Jenard Womble and Nathan Bernard Womble. Great-grandchildren Leilah Moore, Abiyana Eve Moore, Elias Lamar Moore, Craig Arthur Moore, Jr., Christian Aiden Moore and Aziel Pardilov-Moore. Her sister, Sylvania Hedgepeth, and many nieces, nephews, and loved ones.
