November 21, 1992 – August 25, 2026

Tayvon Dayquan Lucius Shuler was born on November 21, 1992, at Lincoln Hospital in the Bronx, New York, to **Tiffini Neal** and **Douglas Shuler**. His life ended far too soon on August 25, 2026. He was just 33 years old.

Tayvon spent his childhood in the neighborhoods of New York City, surrounded by family and friends. He was an adventurous, free-spirited child who approached life with curiosity, energy, and a desire to experience life in his own way.

Tayvon attended **P.S. 153 Adam Clayton Powell Jr. Elementary School** and **P.S. 149 Sojourner Truth**. Later, he attended **LaGuardia Community College**, where he took GED classes as part of his desire to make a meaningful difference in his life and build a better future for himself.

Tayvon was a dreamer with an entrepreneurial spirit. He envisioned one day owning **car dealerships, laundromats, and properties**, building something of his own and creating greater possibilities for his future.

As a young man seeking guidance and a better path for his life, Tayvon became connected with **Arches Transformative Mentoring and Living Redemption Community Development Corporation**. Through those relationships, he found mentors who walked alongside him, encouraged his growth, and remained connected to him through different seasons of his life. Tayvon's relationship with Living Redemption extended well beyond his participation in the program; he remained part of a brotherhood that cared deeply about his life, his progress, and his future.

Over the years, Tayvon resided in New York City, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and New Jersey, making friends wherever life took him. He enjoyed playing basketball and video games, visiting new places, and trying new things—although those who knew him knew that heights were not among his favorites.

Tayvon was **loving, caring, generous, and always strived for fairness**. In recent years, he had begun traveling and developed an even greater desire to see more of the world. He shared a smile that could light up the day and a love that was deeply felt by those fortunate enough to know him.

Though Tayvon's life ended much too soon, the relationships he formed, the memories he created, the dreams he carried, and the love he shared remain.

Tayvon will truly be missed.

Tayvon leaves to cherish his memory his beloved son, **Tayvon Shuler Jr.**; his parents, **Tiffini Neal** and **Douglas Shuler**; his siblings, **Tanasha Neal**, **Kimora Bell**, **Curtis Shuler**, **Victoria Shuler**, and **Nayquan Glenn**; his aunts, **Shantell Neal**, **Yolanda Beale**, and **Teresa Buck**; his 18 cousins; **Gunna**; and a host of extended family members, friends, mentors, and loved ones whose lives were touched by his presence.
