

<u>Carmen Millicent Stewart</u>

Carmen Millicent Stewart, wife, mother, grandmother, accomplished nurse, and devout member of Bellerose Assembly of God in Queens, New York, went to be with the Lord on Tuesday, August 15, 2000.

Carmen was born in Kingston, Jamaica W.I., the second of four children born to Muriel Lawrence. Described by friends and family as a reserved and dignified child, Carmen demonstrated at an early age a unique religious conviction that was to guide, shape and sustain her throughout her life.

Carmen dedicated her life to the Lord and began serving Him at Life Tabernacle in Jamaica, W.I. It was there that she met Patrick Samuel Stewart who would later become her husband. She attended St. Francis Roman Catholic School, where she excelled in her studies. Thereafter, she attended and graduated from Walgrove College, a level of accomplishment to which few Jamaican women of that era could lay claim. After college, Carmen worked with the Department of Treasury in Jamaica until the opportunity arose for her to migrate to the United states in 1966.

In New York, Carmen continued her friendship with Patrick Stewart and their mutual respect, shared religious devotion, and lifelong friendship blossomed into a loving relationship. On August 10, 1968, Carmen and Patrick were married. The following year, the couple welcomed their first child, Colleen Patricia. Their second daughter, Paulette Anita arrived in 1971.

While her daughters were enrolled in preschool, Carmen herself

enrolled in the Borough of Manhattan Community College, where she studied nursing. Four months before she was set to graduate, she gave birth to her third child, a long-awaited son, Samuel Patrick, born on January 29, 1975. Later that year, she completed her studies and started her career in nursing.

Carmen spent most of her nursing career at the Dry Harbor Nursing Home in Queens, New York, where her family had settled. She and her husband, who is an accomplished accountant and college instructor, were able to successfully balance their respective careers and child rearing by never wavering from their core belief in God. It was Carmen's loving persistence that taught her children to diligently serve the Lord and to excel in all endeavors that propelled them to their personal and professional successes.

One of Carmen's proudest moments was when she witnessed the marriage of her son, Samuel, to Karen Thomas in July 1995. From that union, the Stewart's were blessed with three grandsons- Jasahn, Isaiah and Josiah.

On August 15, 2000, just five days after her 32nd wedding anniversary, Carmen Millicent Stewart went to be home with the Lord at the age of 61. She is survived by her loving husband, her three children, her daughter-in-law, her three grandsons, her mother Muriel Lawrence, her brother, Edgerton Lawrence, her sisters, Beverly Miller and Jonett Watson; many nieces, nephews, and other family members.
