Dorothy "Dot" Robinson, age 73, was born in Maxton, North Carolina to the late William and Cicero (Miller) Robinson. She resided in Passaic, NJ since 1958.

She was educated in North Carolina attending the R.D. Dean High School Maxton, North Carolina. Her desire to further her education would lead her to Essex County College Newark where she received her GED and later an Associate's Degree.

She was employed as a Grant Assistant for The City of Passaic, NJ. She was later appointed as the Docket Clerk for Passaic County Municipal Violations Bureau before retiring in 2000. She was co-founder of The Black Women' Council of Passaic, NJ. She was co-founder and member of The Board Community Action Program for the city of Passaic, NJ; there she served as chairperson of every committee and President for two years. She served as President of the Passaic Inter-Agency. She was co-founder of: the Advisory Board of Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Vice President for the Passaic County Chapter of the National Black Caucus on Aging. She served as Vice President of Passaic Branch of the NAACP for two years and Publicity Chairman for two years and a education Chairperson for one year. She was a member of The St. Paul Baptist Church, Passaic, NJ.

She was predeceased by her siblings, Fannie Moore, James "Ben" Robinson, Lelia Lee, Lucille Graham, Wadell Robinson, Gilbert Robinson, Walter Robinson, John Robinson and LeRoy Robinson.

Ms. Robinson departed this life on Sunday, March 13, 2011 at the St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital Wayne, NJ.

She is survived by: her son, James F.
