Once they heard his traveling, barreling voice directing them to stop the excessive horseplay or ending the bickering, they quickly complied. Even outsiders had exposure to Kadeem's voice on many humorous, and sometimes awkward occasions. As a teenage girl, Chenesha's friends mistakenly thought many times, that Kadeem was a boy within their age group, whenever he answered the home phone. Some of them mistakenly asked to meet Kadeem, until Chenesha informed them that her brother was simply a young boy blessed with a deep, manly voice. Similarly, Kadeem's mother, Marcia, consistently fielded suggestions from friends and peers imploring her to ask him to consider public speaking, voice-over television, or radio as possible career endeavors. Kadeem, however, would have no trouble later finding his true passion. As a teenager though, Kadeem was a reliable older brother; always there to pick up his younger sisters Chenelle and Cheniece from day care. Also, as an adolescent he was still able to participate in activities he enjoyed. He enjoyed creating music with his friends, cooking, as well as wrestling and horse playing with his older brother Marlon. And, in recent years playing video games with his younger sisters and exercising at the gym.

Kadeem attended Jane Addams Vocational High School in the Bronx, NY from 2003 to 2007, where he studied Computer Science. After graduating from Jane Addams in 2007, Kadeem had varying interests that begged for his time, such as cooking, mortuary science, traveling, and he readily embraced new and different opportunities outside his immediate community. However, Kadeem settled in rather quickly when he realized his true passion: cooking. In 2007, he enrolled at Monroe College where he majored in culinary arts. Kadeem developed a reputation among family and friends for preparing exquisite and scrumptious meals. He was proud of his cooking. His Italian dishes were tasty and delightful, and was a popular

request among family members during the holidays. While attending college, Kadeem worked full time at Harlem Children's Zone serving as a teacher's aide for a year, assisting students with their homework and advising them on the virtues of excellence in academic performance, and how it relates to success in their future endeavors.

While pursuing his dreams, Kadeem was successful in gaining employment with Allied Barton Security Service as a security officer. Through hard work, dedication, recognized maturity, and strong work ethics, Kadeem was promoted to supervising a small team within a year's time. Kadeem prided himself on regular, dependable work attendance and displayed consistently mature conduct during his two year tenure with Allied Barton, only missing work on one occasion. Kadeem had simple goals; goals that were kept close to his heart. Some of these goals were to earn extra income, travel to specific parts of the world, purchase a vehicle, and secure an early retirement for his hard working mother. Kadeem had one big long-term dream. He had expressed an interest in going on an expedition, but wanted something more meaningful than the typical jaunt to an exotic local. He lived his life believing in strong moral values and ethics that was cultivated and encouraged by his parents and used these principles in a way that encouraged his peers to follow their dreams, and remain on the right path.


