

## Obituary

**DeCosta "Doug" Douglin** was born in Boston, Massachusetts on July 23, 1943 to Claudine (Edwards) and Dayton Douglin. A few years later she relocated to New York City with him and Wendell, his younger brother. Doug was educated in New York City Public Schools and attended Bronx Community College where he earned an associate's degree.

From 1966 to 1968 he served in the US Army. He was stationed in Germany during those years, and was a military policeman. The Army sent him to German language school to translate and he enjoyed meeting locals during his days off by driving around Germany in his VW Bug.

In 1971, DeCosta accepted Christ as His personal Lord and Savior and was transformed. He immediately was baptized, started studying the Bible and telling others about Christ. He amassed a large library of Biblical writings. Not surprisingly, he stamped his checks and anything he sent to people by mail as well as his books and Bibles with

In 1970, he met Harriet Birkett. They married in 1972 and had two children: Clifford, who was born in 1976, and Lea who was born in 1979. They moved from Newark, NJ in late 1976 and then in 1977 bought a home in East Orange, NJ.

He worked as a computer operator for a number of companies including HBO. In the early eighties, he began working for the City of New York and was certified in various computer languages. At the time he retired from the city in 2015, he was working in Hub Maintenance for the city's Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications in Brooklyn.

DeCosta was hospitalized in early June 2017 and was subsequently diagnosed with lung cancer. He passed away on June 29th at Hoboken University Medical Center. (He was predeceased by his mother (1975) and brother (1998). He leaves to mourn his wife, Harriet, his son, Clifford, and his daughter, Lea. In addition, he will be missed by family members: in-laws-- Fred and Norma Birkett, Edmund and Fredericka (Birkett) Evans, Fred and Cheryl Birkett and his cousins, including Herb Lewis, Dolores Bracy, and Larry Riley. Lastly, his absence will be acutely felt by his brothers and sisters at Park Street Chapel, Roselle, NJ as well as a host of co-workers, neighbors, and friends--especially the Murray Family--Dana, Sonjay, and Jarrett (Godson).

We take comfort in the fact that he believed in the Word of the Living God and is now in the presence of His Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.


