She accepted a position in the Financial Assistance office at Utica College after her graduation and continued working there throughout the two years she lived in Utica. She and her mom would go shopping to Walmart to pick up necessities and while also finding a reason to spend time together. Although challenging, she really enjoyed her job and the people she worked with. She continued to work hard and was eventually promoted and became a 911 Dispatch Supervisor.
