### <u>Obituary</u>

**Lena M. Perryman** was born Lena M. Davis to the late Willie Davis and Annie Lizer Davis in Orangeburg County, South Carolina on March 6, 1943. Lena was the sixth daughter out of eight along with her seven brothers. Her siblings were Annie, Hercules, Adam, Brown, James, Estelle, Joella, Myrtis, and Deloris. Her siblings who preceded her in death were Willie, Jr., Calvin, Lillian, Mary, and Ceaser.

As a youth in South Carolina, Lena was an exceptional student and enjoyed playing basketball. When Lena was 19 years old, she moved to New York City in 1962. While in the city, Lena began to establish her career working for the phone company NYNEX, attending night classes, taking care of her two children, Timothy and LaVerne, and married her late husband, Robert E. Perryman. Lena worked her way up in the phone company and was able to become a Chief Revenue Analyst. Lena was a very hard worker; her hard work allowed her to move from Harlem, to the Bronx, to Jersey, and eventually Rockland County. Lena's hard work paid off allowing her to retire in 1985.

In 1995, Lena moved back to Harlem with her daughter, LaVerne to help take care of her late mother, Annie Lizer Davis. Lena and her daughter winded up staying in Harlem after her mother's death in 1997. While in Harlem, Lena began volunteering for Harlem Children's Zone, helping the community, and consulting for HPD.

Lena to all that knew and loved her was a beautiful spirit. Lena remained that same beautiful spirit until her passing on August 9, 2017. Her kindness, love, and strong work ethic are what she will be remembered for.

Lena is survived by: her two children, Timothy B. Davis and LaVerne I. Perryman; her two grandchildren, Javon J. Davis and Kory A. Davis; her nine siblings; and her numerous nieces and nephews.
