Beloved Woman of God

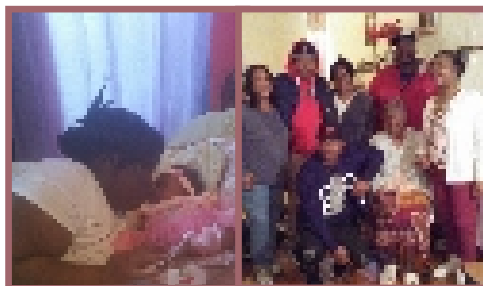
