Mary Robinson White was born on October 10, 1922, in King William County, Virginia, to the late Florence Hill Robinson and John Edward Robinson. While still a toddler, she and her older brother, the late John W. Robinson, and parents moved to Newark, New Jersey.

Mary attended Robert Treat Elementary and Jr. High Schools and graduated from Barringer High School in 1940. That same year she entered Harlem Hospital School of Nursing. After graduating in 1944, Mary served as departmental instructor at Harlem Hospital School of Nursing and City Hospital in Newark. Her love of children compelled her to complete her school nurse's certification at New York and Seton Hall Universities in 1953.

In 1945, Mary married her childhood sweetheart, Clifford R. White. One week after their wedding, Mary joined Bethany Baptist Church, where her husband had been a lifelong member. They enjoyed many happy years together until his passing in 1987.

Mary was employed by the Newark Board of Education, working at Oliver Street School in Newark's Ironbound section for thirty-three years, from 1952 until her retirement in 1985. Upon her retirement, her supervisor stated, "I was always able to call upon Mary to train other nurses. She exemplified the best in school nursing, a perfect model who has done her job well." While employed, Mary was a member of the Newark Teachers' Association, the Newark School Nurses' Association, and the New Jersey Education Association.

Mary was a devoted member of the North Jersey Unit of the National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc., for 61 years. She received the North Jersey Unit's Professional Woman of the Year Award, the Sojourner Truth Award which is the organization's highest honor, the 50-Year Service Award, and in 2012 she received the National Volunteer Service Award (Retired) at the organization's national convention.

Mary's memberships also included being a life member of the N.A.A.C.P., a Subscribing Golden Heritage Member of the N.A.A.C.P., and a member of the Friends of the Newark School of the Arts, where she served as president for many years.

As we all know, Mary had a passion for dance. She was an active and enthusiastic member of the High Class Theater Group, a liturgical dance group whose members range in age from their early sixties to the mid-nineties.

During her 72 years of membership at Bethany Baptist Church, Mary was a member of the Young People's Choir, the Bethany Young Adults (of which she served as president and vice president), the Bowling League, The Welcome Committee, the Altar Guild (where she served as vice president), as well as many other committees.

Mary loved traveling. She had the opportunity to travel to many countries throughout Europe, Africa, and the Caribbean, as well as New Zealand, Australia and throughout the United States. She especially enjoyed road trips with her family. Even in her later years Mary was always on the go. Age did not slow her down, whether playing cards with friends - Connie, Muriel, and "T" - or watching her beloved Mets and Yankees, doing puzzles, sewing, reading or driving friends to and from various places. She lived a vibrant and engaging life.

Mary was a wonderful mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and friend. She leaves to mourn her passing two daughters, Patricia W. Fullilove and Sharon W. Graddy; two sons-in-law, Harold W. Fullilove and Rudolph Graddy; grandchildren Harold W. Fullilove, Jr. (Carolyn), Aaron W. Fullilove (Lucy), Gregory S. Fullilove (Yasmin), Rudolph Graddy, Jr., and Alexandra P. Graddy; great-grandchildren, Sydney, Harold III, Logan, Ava, Luke and Austin Fullilove; sister-in-law, Hettie Raines Robinson; two nieces, Cynthia White Saavedra and Cheryl R. Robinson; nephew, Lawrence E. Street; godchildren, Toy Ellen Banks Hicks, Pamela Banks, Pamela Byrd, Randy Smith and Trent Smith, as well as other relatives and friends.
