

Elder Charlie Hunter Hill was born on December 5, 1936 in Emporia, Virginia to the late Dorothy and Lanie Hill. He was one of 18 children. Charlie touched the lives of many with his cheerful personality, he loved to sing and joke to lift the spirits of those around him. He especially enjoyed capturing special moments, you would hardly ever catch him without a camera or camcorder.

Charlie transitioned to his heavenly rest on Monday, September 11, 2017 at the VA Hospital in East Orange, New Jersey.

He went to school where he learned his trade as a presser. Charlie enlisted in the U.S Army in 1956 serving the United States and Germany. While in Germany he learned his two favorite sayings which were "guten morten" (Good Morning) and "sperechen sie deutch" (Do you speak German?). After being honorably discharged from the Army he lived in Brooklyn,

New York several years before relocating to New Jersey.

Charlie was joined in Holy Matrimony to his wife Nora "Buckie" Hill on July 28, 1967. They met in Newark, NJ through mutual friends. From this union 5 beautiful children were born, Cletis, Deron, Melinda, Tammy and Charity "Renee". He was a family oriented man. Charlie was a devoted husband, spectacular father, a heroic grandfather and great grandfather.

Elder Charlie Hill's new life began on Christmas day in 1975. He received the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior. He was a member of Windows of Heaven Prayer Chapel in East Orange, NJ for 20 years under Reverend Rebecca

Purifory, Pastor. Under her leadership he was ordained as the first Deacon, where he served as the Superintendent of Sunday School, President of the Men's Ministry and several other offices. He was ordained as presiding Elder in 1982, eventually installed as Pastor of Windows of Heaven.


In 2002, Charlie and his wife founded New Beginning Church in Newark, NJ. He later joined New Vision Ministries in Plainfield, NJ under Apostle Forrest and Bishop Jessica Walker. He served faithfully as an Elder, Usher, Greeter and Overseer of the Men's Ministry for 17 years.

He worked at Gleason and Son Cleaners in Maplewood, NJ for approximately 23 years before retiring in 2016. While working there he was dedicated and hardworking; his coworkers were like family to him.
