Obit<u>uary</u>

Bernice Bracey was born on July 22, 1924 in Jedburg, South Carolina, to the Late Isaac and Sallie Gallashaw. She was the second of five siblings; three sisters and one brother: Wilhelmina, Josephine, Lillian and Isaac.

On Tuesday, March 6, 2018, Bernice Bracey, a resident at Seaview Home in Staten Island, NY, was called home by our Lord after a long battle with Alzheimers's. Even in her condition, at times she would smile while humming church hymns.

Bernice married the love of her life, the late George Nathan Bracey Sr., in South Carolina after he fought in WWII and was honorably discharged from The Army in, 1945. They relocated to New York City in the Prospect Heights section of Brooklyn in the late 1940's. There were many family gatherings and celebrations at that home.

Bernice joined Newman Memorial United Methodist Church in 1960, under Reverend Henri M. Deas. She served Newman well, as she held many positions and was a member of numerous committees, including, President of the Parsonage Committee where she founded the Sunday morning coffee hour, and after service fellowship hour; amongst many other endeavors: The Gospel Chorus Voices of Praise under the Director of Music Ministry the late Mr. Douglas Johnson, the Chapelites, attended adult Sunday school, organized church outings such as bus trips and cruises on the Hudson. She also served on various ad hoc committees. In 1979, she moved to St. Albans, Queens but still kept her faithfulness to God and to Newman by continuing as a member until she died. In later years she and George opened their home to foster children; which resulted in two adopted daughters. She also fostered three adult mentally challenged women for years: Helen, Bessie and Jackie.

Bernice was employed as a dietician at St. John's Hospital (now Interfaith Hospital) in Brooklyn, NY. Bernice was an entrepreneur who worked hard and prayed hard to make her dreams a reality. She was good with managing finances and budgeting. If you gave her a dollar, she knew how to turn it into twenty dollars. For a period she hosted parties to sell Tupperware and Celebrity costume jewelry. She also owned and managed a fruit stand from the side of her van near Boys and Girls High School.


Bernice had a flair for fashion and interior design, enjoyed gardening, antique shopping, traveling, loved entertaining by hosting dinner parties and barbecues, and planning fundraising events for her church. The Christmas season was one of her favorite times of the year. Her house would be fully decorated inside and out. Above all things, Bernice loved her family and God. She was a force to be reckoned with, a person you could rely on to get things done. She was the quintessential modern woman of her time.

Bernice's life was committed to serving her community and God. Her service was so apparent that on May 14, 1988 The National Council of Negro Women, in which she was a member, honored her with the Mary McLeod Bethune award, in recognition of achievement in the Bethune tradition.

Bernice leaves seven children to honor her life: George N. Bracey Jr., Joseph W. Bracey, Donald Bracey Sr., Timolin Bracey, Michael T. Bracey, Courtney Bracey, and Keesha T. Bracey. 20 grandchildren: Trenton, Detiesha, Monique, Kareem, Tyree, Donella, Donald Jr., Sabrina, Karie, Timisha, Quenton, Danyale, Oryan, Aisecci, Shamecca, Nelicia, Jalvina, Marshawn, Jahquil and Antique a host of great grandchildren.

Bernice Bracey will be remembered as a loving wife, supportive mother, caring daughter, giving grandmother, trusting friend, and faithful servant to our dear Lord. Her legacy lives on.
