On Saturday, March 10, 2018 at 6:45 pm at Saint Michael's Hospital, Newark, New Jersey, God sent one of his angels to call **Bessie Richardson** from her labor to her reward.

Bessie Mae Bowler (aka Bess) was born October 20, 1942 to the late Edward and Carrie Bowler in Kannapolis, North Carolina. The family migrated from North Carolina to Montclair, New Jersey, where she received her former education throughout the Montclair Public School System.

As the oldest and at a young age, Bess developed protective and nurturing characteristics while overseeing her siblings. She also developed strong work ethics because she wanted her own money to buy the things she wanted, because 'money was very scarce in those days'.

Bess with her strong exterior was swept off her feet with the smooth talk of Bernard Richardson and they later married.

Bess had an innate gift of caring for others...she held various jobs during her life. She worked at the Overbrook Asylum in Cedar Grove, New Jersey, where she realized her life's purpose was caring for others. In the early 1960's Bess received formal training for this field by enrolling in the Nurses' Aide Program at the Mountainside Hospital in Glenridge, New Jersey – where she worked for 37 years. She was affectionately know as "Richie" here. Her love and compassion for others was not limited to her patients, she also represented her fellow employees as a Union Delegate in Local 1199 of Newark, New Jersey until she retired.

The scripture of "train up a child in the way it should go when old will not depart" came to reality when Bess felt the void in spite of being in crowds. Bess started attending Trinity Temple Church Of God In Christ, where she grew spiritually under the leadership of Pastor, Bishop Norman Prescott. Bess was a faithful member of her church. She sang on the Senior Choir after it was re-established under the leadership of Sis. Verla Brown. After Sis. Brown relocated and the choir was dissolved, Bess was approached by Sis. Verna Dowdy to become a member of the Trinity Temple Usher Board. Ushering became a passion of Bess, where she served diligently in that position for many years. As a result of her faithfulness, Bess was appointed President and later was elevated to serve as Jurisdictional Usher Board President of the New Jersey Third Jurisdiction until she was no longer able to serve.

Bess loved spending time with family as well as reading, listening to music, "oldie but goodies" and "spirituals", cooking and can't forget, watching her "soaps" (Bold and The Beautiful and The Young and The Restless)..."Can't talk right now, watching my soaps, will call you back later!" At family gatherings whether it was barbeques or family style dinners Bess was known for her potato salad, cornbread and (we must not forget) the sweet potatoes along with sharing stories from back in the day.
