Growing up in Rahway, Keith enjoyed playing at Brennan field with his friends and also was a paperboy delivering the Elizabeth Journal. Keith loved to play double deck pinochle. Mrs. Mary McLeod taught Keith and her daughter Helene the game when they were about 8 or 9 years old. A few times his father called the McLeod home looking for Keith who would often be found playing cards when he should have been delivering the newspaper. For many years Keith was an official member of "BEC" Boston Express Club where he would play Bid Whist with Helene McLeod, Geraldine Hill Hamer, Dorothy Treadwell, Deborah Aikins Balough, Michael Boyd, and the late Loretta Denise Hunt Vanderhorst and William McLeod. Keith's longtime friendship with Helene since kindergarten garnered him the right to be called her son Enel Webley's Godfather. Keith was good to Enel.

Keith loved to dance and always went to clubs with his friends; he was certainly not a "wall flower". He was an avid biker, had outstanding skills in art and loved working in the yard.

Keith's quest for a deeper spiritual relationship with the Lord, led him to Agape Family Worship Center in Rahway, NJ where Lawrence Powell is the Senior Pastor. Keith was a true worshipper and praised God with his whole heart. At "Agape" Keith was always participating in all aspects of the ministry building longtime friendships with numerous people. He taught Sunday school in the Children's Ministry, he was a part of the Men's Dance Ministry and he was a Greeter and Co-Founder of The Outreach Clothing Ministry.

He was employed by White Rose for 15 years and moved up the ranks to management in the Shipping Department. After retiring from White Rose, he joined the ranks at Amazon for a brief period.

Keith was predeceased by his brother Mark A. Gaston in 2006 and his sister Kim Gaston-Turner in 2015. He is survived by his sister Adrienne Danette Gaston of Rahway, an Aunt Alice Gaston and cousins Kelly and Elaine Gaston of New York, and Uncle Ronnie Wilkerson of North Carolina.
