Michael Anthony James was born February 25, 1951 in Newark, NJ to the late Frederick James and Rosetta Starks. He departed this life on March 13, 2018.

He attended Newark Public Schools where he eventually graduated from Barringer in 1968, starring in football and wrestling. His collegiate path led him to a degree in education at Montclair State College.

After a brief public school teaching stint, Mike transitioned into Newark City Government where he had a long, distinguished career, beginning in the Department of Recreation and Cultural Affairs before moving on to serve as an Executive Assistant to the City Clerk.

Most notably, Michael, along with Congressman Donald Payne and Senator Ron Rice founded the Newark Pop Warner Football League where he served as President for 29 years. The Newark Pop Warner Football League became one of the most successful programs in the region, producing countless NFL signees and at least one NFL Head Coach.

Michael also served as President of Newark Council 21, IFPTE for approximately 20 years. He was also the State Union President.

As a result of Mike's dedication, he was enshrined in the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame on October 13, 2011.

Retiring from public life in 2014, Mike spent time with his wife, Valerie, of 41 years.

He leaves behind to cherish, wife Valerie Mitchell James, sons Ryan M. James, Esq. of Greenville, SC and Jason D. James of South Orange, NJ, granddaughter, Maya Llanes, sister Sharon Young and a host of nieces and nephews, and family pet Bruno.
