Missionary Sylvia Minerva Biel was born in La Romana, Dominican Republic on November 3, 1943. She was the youngest of eight siblings born to Alrica and Wilfred Wigley and the mother of two sons, the late Willy L. Biel and Ernest Biel.

Missionary Biel's childhood was filled with love and joy. Although she was the youngest, she was the wisest. Her gentle wisdom and guidance has led her family through difficult challenges and great triumphs.

Missionary Biel migrated to New York in 1965. She worked for the New York City Department of Education from 1982 until her retirement in 2005. She started as a school cook and eventually became the Supervisor/Nutritionist of that department. Throughout her thirty-three year career, she happily served generations of school children a delicious meal with a kind smile and encouraging words.

Missionary Biel received an Associate degree from the College of New Rochelle in 1984. In March 1987, she received her Personal Care Certificate. In 1990, Missionary Biel received her Associates degree in Nutritional Sciences from LaGuardia Community College. Missionary Biel also attended the Church of Christ Bible Institute and received a Bachelor of Religious Education (B.R.E.) in 2001 and a Bachelor of Theology (B.Th.) in 2005.

Missionary Biel was baptized in Jesus name in 1991, and she received the precious gift of the Holy Spirit that same year. In 1994, Missionary Biel joined the group of Refuge Temple volunteers who visited and prayed for the patients at Montefiore Hospital on Saturdays. Every first Sunday, she would escort patients to the chapel for worship service. Missionary Biel frequently visited the homeless shelters, sick and shut-in and provided special care for saints who were critically ill. In 1995, she began to work in the Six O'Clock Prayer Room tarrying with souls with the late Mother Marian Hall.

Missionary Biel received her Social Missionary license in August 1995. She was elevated to become a Senior Missionary in August 2003 and was appointed Senior Missionary Vice President in the same year. She served as Vice President to Missionary Groups 4 and 8 for fifteen years.

Missionary Biel's first Missionary trip was to the Dominican Republic with Mother Dorothy Anderson, Mother of the Caribbean. She was identified as the person to work with Mother Anderson in the Dominican Republic because she had relatives there and spoke fluent Spanish. After that first trip, Missionary Biel began to work with the Leeward Islands Diocese during the tenure of Apostle James I. Clark, Jr. as Director of the Caribbean. Missionary Biel was appointed Interpreter by the Diocese. As Interpreter for the Diocese, Missionary Biel translated the sermons, teachings and entire services both in Spanish and English for the visiting delegates and the local congregation. In fact, she served as Interpreter for Bishop Davis on her last Missionary trip to the Pastors' Conference in the Dominican Republic in January 2018. For over twenty years, she served faithfully and diligently under the leadership of the first Diocesan Bishop Henry Anderson followed by Apostle Samuel R. Peters, Sr. and currently Bishop Reginald J. Davis, Sr., Director of the Caribbean. It was an awesome experience to observe Missionary Biel as she kept pace with the preachers and translated the message to the congregation. Missionary Biel also helped to send barrels of food, clothing and necessities to the missions in the Dominican Republic.

Missionary Biel was a very humble, loving, caring and dedicated servant of God. 'I can't' was never part of her vocabulary regarding her service to the Lord and His people. She selflessly gave of her time, her labor, her prayers and even her vehicle to bless, encourage and make the saints comfortable. Missionary Biel's favorite scripture was Proverbs 3:5-6, and her favorite song was "Surely Goodness and Mercy".

She leaves to mourn her loss: son, Ernest Biel; brother, William Wigley; sister, Noemi Mercedes Diaz; grandchildren, Renee ("Pumpkin") Biel, Terrance ("Pie") Biel, Daniel Biel, Jason Biel and Christopher ("Little Pie") Kirkland; a host of nieces and nephews; and her Church family.
