Bill was educated in the public schools of Sumter County and attended Ebenezer High School. Bill joined the US Army in November 1953, and served almost 10 years as a Paratrooper and Infantry Marksman. Because of his heroism, he was decorated with the Bronze Star Medal and several other Korean War medals. Bill was honorably discharged from the US Army as a Staff Sergeant in February 1962.



He was a dedicated servant in the church and served as President of the Board of Trustee for many years. After resigning as President, he became President Emeritus. Bill was a member of the Joyful Pilgrims Choir and Male Chorus. Later as a member of the First Zion Hill Male Chorus, bill was a lead singer. One of his favorite songs were "I'm Gonna Make It". Bill was faithful to every auxiliary of the church. Because of his faithfulness, a Breakfast Program was given in Servant. He was Honored by the Hospitality Ministry and The First Zion Hill Church Family.

He was a loving and caring husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather, who was devoted to God and his family. He was known as "Poppa" to his grandchildren, great grandchildren and children of family and friends. He was a mentor to his young nephews and neighborhood boys.
