On Monday, November 12th, 2018, Louis "Danny" McClendon, passed in peace at the age of 62. A native of Harlem, New York, Louis was born to Avon Lewis McClendon and Louis McClendon on January 10th, 1956 in Harlem Hospital. Being the only child Louis had an unbreakable bond with his mother. He loved spending time with her, dancing together to the hits of the 50's and 60's. He adored that time, and it was the highlight of his day.

Louis will always be remembered amongst family and friends as a loving, Father, Grandfather, Uncle, Friend and all around gracious God fearing man. Louis always had a deep love for music. He learned that he had two uncles that sang backup for the Drifters, David Baughan, Sr., and Richard Lewis, Jr. Louis's Aunt Ella Lewis, Jr. was also a singer with the voice of an angel and that made his love for music broaden.

In 1972, "Danny" met the woman whom he always held close to his heart, Claudia Best in Brooklyn, New York where they went on to raise three children together, Lanora Best (Joe Monk), Morticia Witters (husband, Curtis Witters) and Troy McClendon. His three children, seven grandchildren, Shadiyah, Anthony, Jaishaun, Antoinette, Sharissa, Keyshawn, and Makazia; and one great grandchild, Eli, will always remember Louis. His extensive family of aunts, uncles, and cousins who all loved him dearly will also remember Louis.

In Louis' professional career he was a longtime business professional in the insurance industry and always dreamed of getting further involved with the music entertainment field. In 1984, David, Jr. and "Danny" was signed to RCA records as The Kool Krew. They were one of the first Hip Hop groups to be signed to RCA records in 1985; releasing some of Hip Hops most influential commercial releases "Strong Survive" and "Tenement". In September of 2014, "Danny" evolved into the radio personality "Poppa L's" as he began his journey in radio broadcasting, with his son, Troy McClendon, son-in-law, Dom and Levonne of the Office Boys NY. Louis made his radio debut thanks to Tammie Bella, and Kenny Black of Poetic Designs Radio where he got his first airtime slot for Poppa L's Old School Flava Sunday's having three successful seasons. The Poppa L's Old School Flava Sunday Radio show grew to be a syndicated radio network on Hot1079, Beat 94.7 FM based out of Charlotte, NC and WJOB 93.3 FM in Binghamton, NY collectively building a listening audience from 823,000 on its shows debut in April of 2014 to a listenership of 3.2 million both in the states and internationally.
