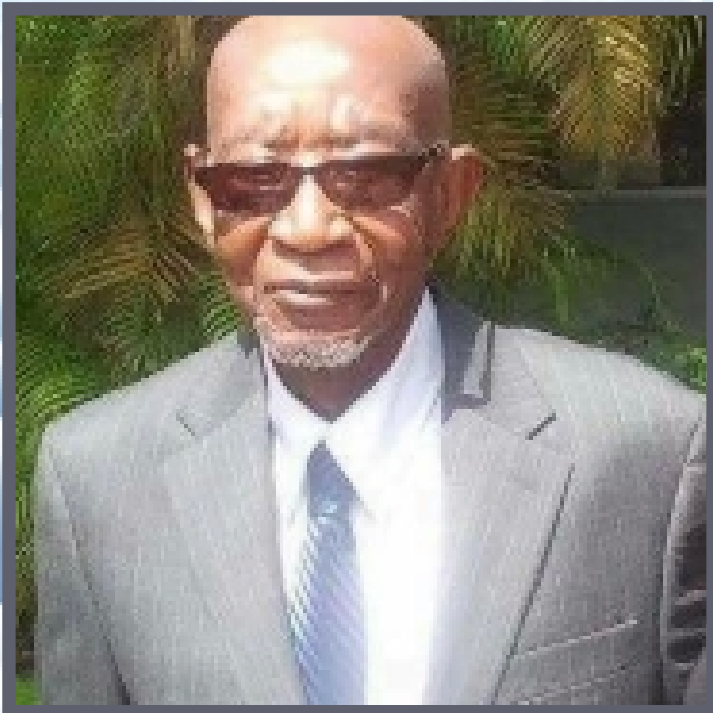

Obituary

Dad helped everyone. If you needed help he was there, we all have that part of him. We often laughed and joked about dad fixing things. We would say "Dad, you fixed it but you left a part off". He would say, "oh you don't need that!"

Dad loved spending time with his grandchildren and great grandchildren. He would often give them words of wisdom about life. He was there for his first grandchild's birth, Jeffrey, and said proudly that day "he smiled at me." He loved watching sports, betting on the horses, and playing the pick-it.

He leaves behind to cherish his memory his five children and son-in law, Vera (James), Vanessa, Robin, Robert Anthony and Michael (Ann). He also leaves behind to cherish his memory his grandchildren, Jeffrey, James, and Jared Agee, Monique and Dante Bouey, Robert Anthony and Teona Bouey, and his great grandchildren Jayla, King, and Iyanna.
