## <u>Obituary</u>

Marie Louis-Jean was born on August 22, 1946 in Aux Cayes, Haiti to Saintileme and Clemence Durand. After the unfortunate passing of her biological mother, she was adopted and raised by her aunt Arielle Michel. She was called home to glory on Saturday, November 17, 2018 at Montefiore Hospital, Bronx, N.Y.

While in Haiti, Marie married her late husband Jean Marie Louis-Jean. After arriving in the United States, she married Julio Leon. She made Brooklyn, NY her home for many years working in laundry mats and factories to raise money to bring over her two eldest children from Haiti, while tending to her two younger children, which were born in the United States. Marie endured many professional and personal adversities and challenges so that her two older children could have a better life in the United States. They were finally able to be united as family in December of 1979.

Marie later earned her certification and worked as a Nurse's Aide for 27 years, which she immensely enjoyed. After devoting her time to being a Nurse's aide, she found a new devotion, The Lord. She loved The Lord deeply and was an Ambassador. The latter part of her life, which was during her retirement, was dedicated to going out into the streets of New York to distribute spiritual tracts and testify about her "True Love," Jesus Christ—her savior and deliverer. She would go into hospitals and nursing homes to sit with the sick and forgotten. She didn't take on this task alone, she recruited her grandchildren on this spiritual journey. Her grandchildren would pass tracts and proclaim the goodness of The Lord alongside their grandmother like soldiers. Not long after seeking a church, she made The Greater Refuge Temple in Harlem, NY her church home for the last 29 years, where she faithfully served on the choir and mothers board.

She was well loved and respected by her church family. To pass the time in between ministering, you would often find her doing her crossword puzzles and/or watching reruns of her favorite comedic sitcoms: Sanford & Son, Three's Company, The Jeffersons, and The Honeymooners.

During her battle with renal failure, Marie exemplified a true spiritual warrior. She weathered dialysis for the last 10+ years with an amazing amount of strength and discipline. She was loved by her Dialysis family over at The Bronx River Nephro-Care Center, where she was cared for like family by such a great team of doctors (Dr. Guccione and Dr. Leo), Head nurse (Jackie), technicians (Janet and Baby Boy), administrative staff (Bernadette and Peggy), transportation support (Spanky), primary care physician (Dr. St. Louis) and so many more.

Marie is survived by her: Four children: Junia Louis-Jean, Suze Louis-Jean, Peggy Jean-Nicholas and Harris Jean; Five grandchildren: Tatiana June Stabler, James Louis-Jean, Gregory Jervae Jean, Miana Collette Nicholas, and Seth Matthew Nicholas; Eight great grandchildren: Ameera Louis-Jean, Jaden Toussant, Jeremiah Toussant, James Louis-Jean Jr., Paris Stabler, Joshua Stabler, Justin Stabler, Jacob Stabler.

She has left an incredible mark on all who knew her and will be sorely missed. It is now for us to carry the baton and run this race.
