**Deacon Curtis Witherspoon** was born on September 17, 1918 in Richmond, Virginia to William and Lela Carter Witherspoon. He was the second child of three children.

Deacon Witherspoon attended the Public Schools of Lynchburg, South Carolina. At the age of sixteen he moved to Bayonne, NJ and graduated from Bayonne High School. Deacon Witherspoon served his country with honor and valor as a member of the United States Navy during World War II, doing most of his tour of duty in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Deacon Witherspoon held several employment positions retiring from Mobay Chemicals, Bayonne, NJ. He learned the skills of Cabinet Making and Upholstery. For more than six decades Deacon Witherspoon has given generously of his time, energy and resources to Friendship Baptist Church in many ways as a Trustee and Deacon Emeritus.

Deacon Witherspoon was honored as Man of the Year on Sunday November 14, 2010 in recognition of his outstanding service to his fellow citizens and longtime spiritual involvement in his Church, receiving a New Jersey State Senate Resolution presented by Senator Sandra Cunningham.

Recognized with an array of awards and honors, Deacon Witherspoon has displayed his public spirit through his dedication and commitment to V.F.W Flournoy-Gethers Post No. 7470. Serving as Post Commander from 1954-1956. He was honored to be selected as Co-Grand Marshall for a Memorial Day Parade.

Other affiliations include the Bayonne Branch of the NAACP where he held the office of Second Vice President. He was a Charter Member and Past Master of Omega Lodge No. 64 F & A.M.P.H.A. and also served in many other capacities. Past Master Witherspoon was honored at the Grand Convocation on June 24, 2017 for 65 years in Masonry, by the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge Free and Accepted Masons for the State of New Jersey, under the leadership of MW Sheldon J. Prescott Grand Master. He was also a Charter Member of Omega Chapter No. 60 O.E.S.P.H.A He was the First Patron and served as Patron for six more terms.

Deacon Witherspoon's resolute trust in God was evident as he silently answered His call from labor to reward on Wednesday, January 23, 2019 at Trinitas Medical Center in Elizabeth, NJ. A celebration of his Victory in Jesus takes place as he joins his parents, brothers William and Floyd who preceded him in death.
