


Chester Leake Wooten Jr. was born in Jersey City, NJ the eldest of five children of Chester Sr. and Lucille Wooten.

Chet, as he was affectionately known, attended Public School #22 and Lincoln High School. During his high school years he played basketball and football for Lincoln High School. After High School he attended Morgan State College. While attending college he was drafted into the United States Army where he served for three years active duty and four years in the reserves. During that time, he was stationed in Fort Dix, New Jersey and in Panama. Following his military service in the Army he returned to Morgan State University and earned a bachelor's degree in History in 1965.

After graduating from college, Chet became involved in social activism and civil rights and became a member of various organizations including the NAACP, CORE, and the Black Panther Party. He worked in various New York City agencies and retired from the City of New York after thirty-seven years of service. In 1978, he formed his own consulting firm, Chet Wooten Associates, Ltd. to engage in consulting and advisory work.

Chester's first marriage to Muriel Fowler blessed him with two children Jeffrey and Mark. As a father, Chet exposed his sons to all he knew and worked to make them well rounded men.

While working in New York, Chet met Patricia Cloud and their friendship blossomed into a thirty seven year

marriage. Chet was a loving father to Patricia's daughter Sherlon.

***Chet** loved playing tennis, hunting, bowling, bid whist, traveling, casinos, and spending time with family and friends. Chet always had sage advice for friends and family when they needed it. He was kind hearted, compassionate, a Christian, a mentor, a lover of his family and friends, and a man of distinction. These and other such qualities characterize the life of Chester L. Wooten Jr..*


Over the past several years Chet's health declined and Patricia with great love and devotion cared for Chet unconditionally until his sunset.





