

Obituary

William Stephen Keller of Waldwick, New Jersey was born on August 26, 1936 to the late William Stephen Keller, Sr. and Helen (Lakatos) Keller. William was the oldest of 5 children born of this union.

William, affectionately known as 'Bill' was educated in the New Jersey Public School System and earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Education from Kean University in Union, New Jersey. William was a Special Education Teacher with the Paterson School District from which he retired in 2001.

William (Bill) will always be loved and remembered as a brother of the highest honor and faithfulness to his mother Helen Keller and his four siblings: Barbara, John, Caroline, and Michael.

Bill had quite a few loves in his life...family, church, the outdoors (hunting and fishing) and woodworking. All these "loves" kept Bill quite busy. However, with all these 'loves,' Bill continued to be a good husband and provider. At an early age, he devoted his early years to helping his mother provide for the family due to the death of his father when Bill (the oldest of 5 children) was only 12 years of age. With God's help and Bill's creativity, the family was able to stay together. That care, nurturing, and creativity continued throughout his life. Bill was an excellent cook, and he loved to bake. He taught his wife Marie (his wife of 25 years) how to make the best cheesecake ever!!! Bill welcomed any opportunity to spend time with his family (often fishing with his brother Michael and nephew Seth). Much of his time was spent using his God-given gift of wood-carving/carpentry to his church, Greater Centennial AME Zion Church, Mt. Vernon, NY where Bill was a committed tither, he never hesitated to offer to use his gift to help glorify God. To his church, he devoted his gift of carpentry and woodcarving. If we were to look around the church today, we will see Bill Keller...look at the Guest Podium & the Baptismal Font...Bill refurbished them both; look at the Sound Board Case, he built it from scratch; look in the fellowship hall, he built that podium...look in the finance room, he built the counting tables around the room; look at the portable table for offerings, he built that as well. He also built the first communion removable communion rack. Bill loved his God and he loved his church!

As time went on, Bill was unable to do these things as much as he would have liked. This was often frustrating to Bill. He showed how "creative" he really was when his car key was taken from him so he wouldn't be tempted to drive. That didn't stop Bill, he actually called Enterprise Car Rental and had them pick him up from the house so he could rent a car. Bill used the rental car to drive to the woods to feed apple to the deer (I know Bill was thinking...you all can't stop me!). When Bill was finished, he returned the car to the rental agency and called his step-daughter...to her shock and surprise and asked her to pick him up! Bill's mind was clearly still working quite well. Bill, you will be missed.

William made his earthly transition on Thursday, April 4, 2019, at Valley Hospital, Ridgewood, New Jersey.

Bill leaves to cherish precious and wonderful memories: his wife Marie Keller (Amangoua); four sons, William Stephen Keller, III, Henry Keller, Shawn Keller, Christopher Keller; one Step-daughter, Ana Corrinne Nebout; 2 brothers: John Keller (Janet), Michael Keller (Ruth); 2 sisters, Caroline Keller, Barbara Schnuck; Step-grandson, Seway (Willie). He is also survived by a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and his beloved church family.


