On Saturday, April 6, 2019, Tashaun Basil Skinner departed this life at Burlington Woods Center in Willingboro at the age of twenty-nine.

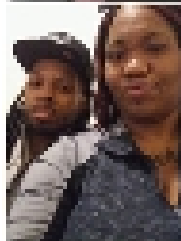
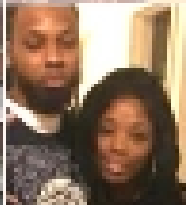
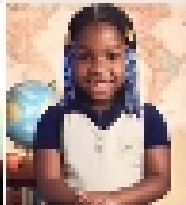
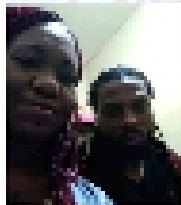
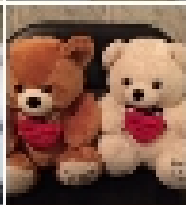
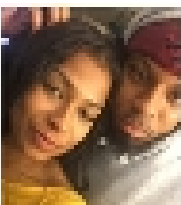
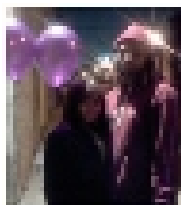
He was predeceased by his children: Ta’Quan and Ta’Asia; grandmothers, Carrie and Emma-Jean; and brother, Antione.
