<u>Obituary</u>

On May 8, 1940, in Berkeley County, South Carolina, John Henry Lloyd and Annie Irene Lloyd were blessed with the birth of a son, Willie Norris "Road Runner" Lloyd.

Norris received his education in the public schools of Berkeley County. During his time living in South Carolina as a young man, he played baseball as a pitcher on the neighborhood team.

Upon graduation from high school, he moved to New York City, and this is where he met the love of his life. Norris was united in Holy Matrimony to Hester Lloyd on November 11, 1971. Hester and Norris raised their two children impressing upon them the value of loving God and family.
