Marcia's Journey

"Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven."

[Matthew 5:16]

Dr. Marcia "Pat" Jones began her journey on October 14, 1959. She was born in Morant Bay, St. Thomas, Jamaica. She was the second daughter of Ashton Jones (deceased) and Etta Jones.

As a child, Marcia attended Duncans All Age School. From there, she went on to Westwood High School (Trelawny, Jamaica). She eventually chose nursing as her profession and obtained a degree in Nursing from the University Hospital of the West Indies, Mona Campus (Kingston, Jamaica) in 1981. She then immigrated to New York for a short time before relocating to England, where she resided from 1983 to 1986.

While there, she obtained a degree in Midwifery from Warrington Hospital (Cheshire, England) in 1985. Shortly after, she returned to New York to pursue a career in Midwifery and Nursing while continuing her education. She obtained a BS in Women's Health from Empire State College (1988) and a MS in Nursing and a certificate as advanced practice nurse specializing in Midwifery from Columbia University (1990). She also obtained a Doctorate in Nursing from Case Western Reserve (2002) and a Nursing Education/Post Masters Certificate from Hunter College (2009).

She began her career in teaching at Lehman College (Bronx, NY). She served as an adjunct professor there from 1993 - 1996 and later transitioned to Columbia University (New York, NY) from 1993 – 2003 as an Assistant Professor.

She embarked on her career as an Associate Professor, Certified Nurse –Educator and a Nurse-Midwife specializing in Women's Health at Bronx Community College in 2002 until 2019.

She was a contributing author of numerous publications as well as an international presenter on Women's Health.

Her personal interest was in global health and providing healthcare services and education to indigent populations in African and the Caribbean. As such, she was a longstanding active member of The Organization for International Development, Inc. (OID) which provided free medical, dental and humanitarian services to over 500 indigent persons in rural communities.

She was a devout Christian and a founding member of First Community Church of the Nazarene. She served as Regional Director for Medical Missions and the president of Nazarene Missions International, Metro New York District. She was also an active member of the Interfaith Caring Community.

Dr. Marcia Jones was an avid traveler who has been to over 54 countries and 28 states. She was an "ambassador" of nursing knowledge and clinical expertise with passion and compassion in the process of educating and serving others.

She leaves behind her mother, Etta Jones; daughter, Merisa; granddaughter, Swoon; sisters, Angella, Dell, Paulette, Pauline and Marsha; brothers, her beloved John and several uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, in laws and friends to mourn her loss.
