Eulogy

**Ezekiel Williams** took his last step on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 2019 to a place of rest; to say "Lord I am here, it is done, it is done, I am here forever with you." Ezekiel was the most loving father, husband, brother, confidant, and friend, who some called 'Junior', some called Willie, and others called Papa. Many knew him as "the man of Good Deeds", always putting others before himself. If you needed him, all you'd have to do was call. He was a kind, decent person in every way.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, he was the youngest of 5 children, to mother Willie Mae Barnhardt and father Ezekiel Williams, Sr. He spent his early years in Cleveland, but eventually moved to New York as a young boy. He grew up on the West side of Harlem and in his adulthood made his way up to the Bronx; it is where he remained for the rest of his life. He was married to his wife Julie in 1986, and together they raised two beautiful children. He worked at the Jewish Guild for Aged Blind home for 22 years.

In 2005, Ezekiel suffered a stroke that completely changed his life and the lives of those closest to him. Although he had difficulties in the beginning and many obstacles to overcome, he showed immense strength and perseverance, allowing him to return home [the following year] to remain with his family for the next 12 years.

Ezekiel was an amazing artist with a talent for creating paintings and drawings for his friends and family to enjoy. He further enjoyed family outings, picnics, watching movies and throwing fun parties throughout his life. He was known to be a 'people's person' and got along with most who met him. He had a way with words and a charm about him that could put those who spoke to him at ease. He loved to laugh and loved for those around to also be in good spirits. He was kind, patient, and easy to get along with.

He is survived by his wife, Julie; 2 children, Natasha and Clayton; grandson, Jayden; brother, Billy; sister, Geneva; sisters-in-law, Gladys and Clara; brother-in-law, Alfonso; and countless nieces, nephews, cousins, and siblings-in-law. He leaves a host of friends and relatives to cherish his memory, and it is important never to forget the good times or the reasons why we loved him so. May his soul rest in harmony and everlasting peace, until we see him again.
