# Her Journey in Life

Deborah's life began February 5, 1958 in the old Martland Medical Center on Bergen Street, Newark, New Jersey (today UMDNJ). She was the 3rd of seven children born to her parents Minnie Mae and Major Gaffney Jr. (M.J.).

#### Her Education

Deborah attended Newark and Plainfield public schools, plus entered Essex County College in Newark seeking her Associate Degree in Health Care.

#### Her Career

Deborah's work in the health care profession began at Lyons V.A. Hospital, Lyons, NJ; taking care of our Veterans for eight years. After leaving the V.A. Hospital, she became certified as a Home Health Attendant taking care of the sick and disabled. She loved helping anyone in need. She remained in this profession for 15 years until she became unable in 2001 to continue the work she so deeply loved

#### Her Union

Deborah was joined in union to Frank Davis by Elder Bernard Davis (General Elder) officiating minister.

#### Her Walk as God's Servant

Deborah was christened in The House of God Church at the young age of seven by the Late Chief Helper Henry Dillard, who was appointed General Elder of the North Jersey Diocese; the Late Bishop W. H. Davis Presiding Prelate. A few years later the Gaffney family relocated to the Plainfield area and became members of The House of God, New Brunswick, New Jersey; The Late Rebecca E. Griffin, Pastor. Elder Griffin united the Gaffney Family (7 siblings), Johnson Family (9 siblings) and the Alice Darby Family (10 siblings) as one Family in the church...in the faith and doctrine...and the community. She taught all to love and support each other no matter what happens. Deborah was saved as a child and grew up in the church singing with her brothers and sisters as "The Gaffney Children." When she strayed away she returned singing "The Devil Thought He Had Me: But I Got Away!" Now under the pastorship of her mother in Plainfield she was appointed to the staff of deacons. Deacon Sidney Byrd, Deacon James Johnson, and Deaconess Mildred Johnson told

her "if you're going to be a deacon, be a good deacon, one that your pastor can depend on." Deborah not only became, she remained this dependable deacon even when she transferred into the Downstate New York Diocese in 2008 under the pastorship of her mother in Freeport, NY. She served her church faithfully as an ordained deacon on the local, state, and general levels. She was always willing to do whatever she could to make all look good! She worked untiringly as the State Youth

Coordinator for many years in the Downstate New York Diocese.


Deborah fell asleep May 10th, 2019 in Doctor's Hospital, Augusta,
