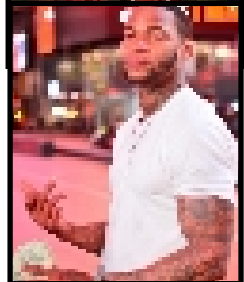
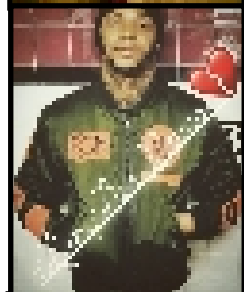
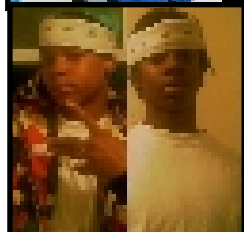
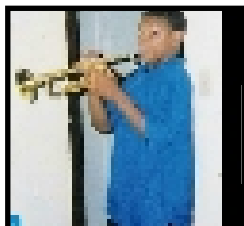
Obituary

Terrence Jaral Wilson Jr. (Bam /Bamo), died unexpectedly in his hometown of Newark, NJ at 11:04 am on June 4, 2019 at the age of 26. 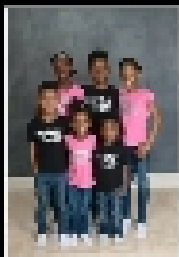
