Early on Friday morning, July 5, 2019, God called one of his angels home. **Reverend Mother Rosalee Singletory Morant-Allbritton.** Rosalee was born on June 30, 1924 in Sumter, South Carolina to the late Albert Morant and Sister Maggie Singletory.

Reverend Morant-Allbritton, later moved to New York where she met and fell in love with her soul mate, Brother Fred Allbritton. They were united in union on June 20, 1962. She worked in the garment district until her retirement. Rosalee loved children and her passion was aimed to encourage the youth in striving to be better and stay with the Lord.

Reverend Rosalee Allbritton loved the Lord. She accepted Christ as her Savior at a young age and continued serving him as a faithful member of Upper Room Baptist Church, Inc. She showed her love for the Lord by serving him in many ministries such as; Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent. Reverend Mother Allbritton sang in the senior choir for over thirty years and was one of the "Song Birds" of the choir. She was President of the Missionary for many years and was in charge of the Women's Annual Day. Rosalee was also the Vice President of the Pastor's Aide until her illness. Anything that was needed, she was there to pitch in. She was an exceptional prayer warrior for the Lord and a devotional leader.

God elevated her to be a licensed Evangelist under the leadership of Reverend James Williams and later was ordained as a Reverend under the leadership of Reverend David Luckey, Sr. She loved to preach and spread the word of God. In 2016, Reverend Mother Rosalee Allbritton entered Pelham Parkway Nursing Care and Rehabilitation Facility, LLC. They took good care of her while she was there. Mother Rosalee Allbritton, was preceded in death by her soul mate Brother Fred Allbritton; sisters, Ophelia Wilson and Margaret Whiteside; brothers, Albert Morant, John Morant and Willie Morant.

She leaves to cherish her memories nephew, John (Grace Pena) Morant; Goddaughter, Reverend Dr. Ruth McCoy, Bronx NY; beloved Pastor Reverend David Luckey, Sr.; a host of nephews, nieces, relatives, her Upper Room Baptist Church family and friends who loved her dearly.
