God, in His infinite wisdom, on Tuesday, August 27, 2019 dispatched one of his guardian angels to the Jersey City Medical Center in Jersey City, NJ to bring home **Windford Hammonds** affectionately known as "Wink".

On June 18, 1937, Windford was born in Lake Waccamaw, NC, to Jim and Mamie Ruth Hammonds. Windford accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized in Fair Bluff, NC. He was educated in the Lake Waccamaw Public Schools System where he completed high school. After high school Windford joined the United States Army in 1955. While in the Army he diligently participated in the Chemical Corps through various training courses. His ongoing duties included being a survey monitor at the Atomic Energy Commission in Nevada, Las Vegas and trained military personnel on effects of atomic weaponry. He was Honorable Discharge 1958. He was very proud to serve his country and many of his conversations included his travels in the United States Army.

In the 60's, Windford moved to Jersey City and was employed by Ferraro Trucking Company, as a Truck Driver for 29 years. He was the go to person on his job. He retired in 1989 due to disability, but was always call upon for advice regarding his knowledge in the Trucking Industry. He was a member of the Teamsters Local 617.

Windford was a humble man and retirement suited him well. He spent his pastime watching his favorite team the New York Mets, Westerns and doing puzzles. He enjoyed driving daily to Bergen Bread & Butter in Jersey City to purchase the Jersey Journal Paper and play his Lottery Pickets. If you knew "Wink" you knew a person who was known for very few words, but was always willing to go beyond the Call of Duty for others. He had a Heart of Gold.

He was preceded in death by his parents Jim and Mamie Ruth Hammonds; sisters Mary Evans and Ruby Wiant; brothers Velton and Alton Hammonds.

He is remembered with love and memories by: special love Rose Marie; two sons Virgil Wayne Maddox of Jersey City, NJ and Stephen Lamont (Sandra) Maddox of Williston, Vermont; one daughter Andrea Maddox Moore of Greensboro, NC; a host of grandchildren, great-grandchildren; sisters Martha Crockrell of Pasadena, CA and Hilda (Harold) Suggs of Annapolis MD; brothers Raymond Hammonds of Chadbourn, NC, John (Monica) Hammonds of Charleston, SC and Leslie (Diane) Hammonds of Chadbourn, NC, Sister in-law Mary Hammonds of Branchville, SC; special daughter and son Barbara Waddell and Darold Waddell of Jersey City, NJ and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.









