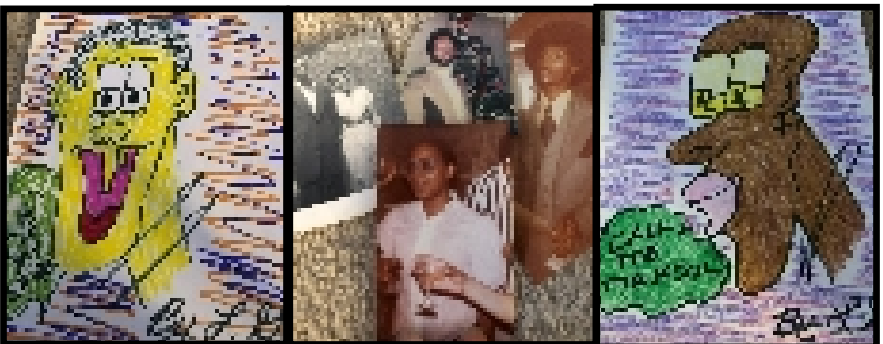
Obituary
