Sylvia attended church with Emily and Rose was her hairdresser. She could be often found in Hackensack often at one of brothers Sam's famous barbecues.

Sylvia attended elementary school in Garfield, NJ. She graduated from Central & Technical High School in Newark, NJ. She excelled in mathematics, typing and stenography.

Tootsie, as she was nicknamed desired to become a bookkeeper however her life path changed. She met and married Stephen Morris and this union produced two children, Gary and Denise.

Sylvia was baptized at a young age. A good parent, she taught her children about Christ and took them to church and taught them to pray.
